## STATISTICS OF DISABILITY EMPLOYMENT DISPARITY

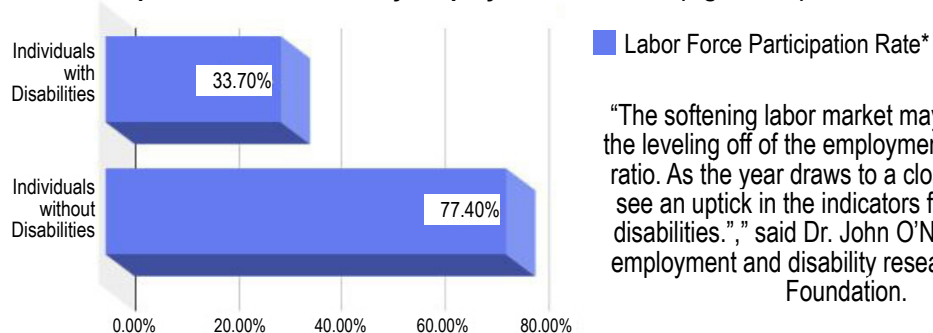
In September 2019, 4,714,000 workers with disabilities (working-age 16-64) represented 3.2 percent of the total 147,935,000 workers in the U.S.
